

ROOF BOOKS

Twenties by Jackson Mac Low

The master of chance operations has composed 100 separate poems intuitively and spontaneously. The title, *Twenties*, refers to the poems' physical form: each has twenty lines, divided into five nonmetrical quatrains. Though written by largely "subjective" methods, these poems both problematize the subject from which they proceed and empower each reader to become a coproducer of their meaning.

"Mac Low... gives exact attention. No added flavor: just it. His poetry sets us ecstatic, though he insists we speak it 'soberly and clearly (as in serious conversation).' Musician, he introduced poetry to orchestra without syntax. Poet, he 'sets all well afloat.' That's why his poetry, even though it looks like it, is poetry."

Kusudama by Yoshioka Minoru (trans. Eric Selland)

Yoshioka's *Kusudama* is a grab-bag of language, object, and event where temporal, cultural, and spatial boundaries are crossed in a collage of inner voices and quotations. A major figure in the Japanese avant-garde following WWII, Yoshioka quotes Western works as readily as Japan's own classic literature, placing sexual and religious references side by side. East and West, inner and outer, are inextricably mixed. He died in May 1990 while this volume was being prepared for publication. 52pp. \$12.

The Book of During by Clark Coolidge

OXOTA: A Short Russian Novel by Lyn Hejinian

Composed of 270 free sonnets inspired by Pushkin's Evgeny Onejin, Oxota: A Short Russian Novel proposes and enacts an intimate and restive portrait of life in Russia today. The fruit of many years' interest in, study of, and travel through the country, Oxota transforms with epic confidence Hejinian's social and artistic life abroad into a richly peopled landscape—witness

ing the vulnerability felt when "A swooning of the heart over connotation" reveals a post-modernist (dis)placement that "puts things in places/ And what have we truly experienced/ The intensity, said Rosa, of empty places".

The Cell by Lyn Hejinian

Hejinian's latest collection of poems, *The Cell*, connoting, as its title suggests, biological life, imprisonment, closure, and circulation, continues to display her magical blend of logic and contradiction, her sense of narrative impetus stopped in its tracks by an aphoristic wit. 154pp. \$11.95.

Selected Poems: 1963-1973 by David Antin

One of the greatest performance poets of this century, David Antin is well known internationally for his "talk poems"—brilliantly spun improvisatory fables of contemporary society using all the traditional rhetorical and prosodic devices of poetry. Antin's early poems and fictions are testaments to his poetic achievement and the precursor of his current projects collected in *Talking at the Boundaries*, and *Dialogue*.


Rough Trades by Charles Bernstein

In Rough Trades Bernstein takes language in every direction possible, from the straight lines of jokes filled with pauses (George Burns) to the paratactic lines of Henny Youngman, from the lines of Maoist thinking to the line of ladies' dresses which his father pushed—not down the street, but upstairs in a factory. New ideas and emotions hit and bounce and point and disappear into the horizon and reappear out of perspective.

I Don't Have Any Paper So Shut Up by Bruce Andrews

At once irreverent, serious, silly, intellectual, sexual, and relevent, *Shut Up* is a brilliant kaleidoscope of the social-sexual political realities of the late 20th century. *Shut Up* is Andrews' most accessible work to date: but it is also writing so raw and powerful that it will infuriate some of its audience. "I can't watch the freedom," the poet angrily proclaims. "Astronauts would only prefer the hula, harmalite, tissue blots off Judeo-Christian sunset—church a regular wound museum... Timesharing Jesus—boys one smirking boys one shot." 310pp. \$13.95.

The Quietist by Fanny Howe

A sequence of poems which is in continual play with its internal juxtapositions and the visual field created by the graphics which surround the poems. The poems have a simplicity searching "For what's contingent on the reason / For being in the world. / Less words, more sound. / Less nature, more words."

Crowd and not evening or light by Leslie Scalapino

A book-length poem in eight sections, the last of which is poems 'on' (or by) photographs mostly of people standing in water (taken by the author) as if the flat surfaces reflected upon the sections of the poem which precede this section and are also an extension past it. Several of the poem's sections are 'poems which are plays'; these have been performed by the Poets Theater in San Francisco and the Eye and Ear Theater in New York.

What I Believe Transpiration / Transpiring Minnesota by Robert Grenier

A series of three sequences of poems, comprising 66 8-1/2 x 11 inch pages hand-numbered by the author & presented in a beautiful two-piece hinged box designed to allow reading the text therein, in sequence, or examination/juxtaposition of unbound poems arranged at will. For Grenier, the series enacts a departure from his instrument, the typewriter, commencing with thick typewritten strokes which evolve into handwritten characters prefiguring his fourcolor holograph text-in-progress, r h y m m s. Grenier's poems are drawings which are 'drawn' as if from the other side of the paper. A little magic book, to bring the hand into the world.

Demo to Ink by Ron Silliman

Demo to Ink comprises six long poems ("Demo," "Engines," "Force," "Garfield," "Hidden," and "Ink") which together present the largest gathering of Ron Silliman's ongoing work The Alphabet yet to be published as a single volume. Gathering is what Silliman does, and does so well, here in poetic modes which include and range among the personal, political, individual, cultural, loud, quiet, comedic, surprising and quite serious, in a way which makes everything count as idea, sound, and physical substance.

or 14 years, the Segue Foundation has distributed books and magazines that are rarely available in commercial bookstores. Thanks to grants from the National Endowment of the Arts and the New York State Council on the Arts, the Foundation is able to make these publications more easily available by providing one central address from which to order.

The poetry represented by these publications has caused more controversy than any other in contemporary literature. It asks the reader to reconsider what constitutes writing as an art and to provide the contemplative space for the natural and social worlds to intermingle. The language addresses the page, the reader, and the composing ear.

These works, selected from among the best of contemporary writing in the English language, invoke an intense experience of how the world is made tangible by writing. The only way to read poetry (and poetics) of this kind is slowly, with patience for its difficulties of technical brilliance and imagination.

This year we have added new titles not previously available to a national audience as well as selecting titles from last year's list of publishers. For new readers, we suggest purchasing a few issues of magazines or anthologies which provide an introduction to the work. For readers concerned with the theoretical underpinnings of the writing, see our listing of current titles in poetics on page 4).

Segue distributes what Publishers Weekly calls "an increasingly important force in contemporary American poetry, since its inception 15 years ago."
