Thanks to grants from the National Endowment of the Arts and the New York State Council on the Arts, the Foundation is able to make these publications more easily available by providing one central address from which to order.

These publications may provoke. They may call on the reader to reconsider what constitutes writing as an art. They will certainly dazzle with technical brilliance and imagination. But more than anything else, these works will invoke an intense experience of the world made tangible by writing.

This year we have carefully added new titles not previously available to a national audience as well as selecting titles from last year's list of publishers. For new readers, we suggest purchasing a few issues of magazines which provide an introduction to the work. For readers concerned with the theoretical underpinnings of the writing, see our listing of current titles in poetics (p. 8).

We use a drop-ship system by which your orders are passed on to the individual publishers for shipping. If you order multiple items, you will receive multiple shipments from different addresses. To encourage ordering by mail, we do not charge postage. Since we do not warehouse books, there is little overhead and the lion's share of your check goes directly to the publisher. In this way your order supports new expression in literature in a way no other distributor can.
